Camp Naper is sure to inspire a summer of learning, fun, and wonder!”

Naper Settlement’s list of camps this summer includes six new offerings, and all camps provide levelled activities for younger and older campers. Highlights include:

- **Naturally Naper** (June 7-11): Campers will brush up on botany and learn about geology while investigating the riches of nature and renewable resources.
- **Strategy: Survival** (June 28-July 2): Campers will train for survival in nature by learning how to pitch tents, be first aid ready, and stay safe in the water.
- **Civil War Camp** (July 6-8): Campers will explore the differences between historical and modern strategy, planning, and progress.
- **Sketch and Sculpt** (July 26-28): Campers will get messy with paint and clay, make their own comic book, and more during this creative camp.

All camps are from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., with drop off available for parents beginning at 8 a.m. Registration for Camp Naper will be offered online this year for the first time.
